


Allamanda, Dwarf

Allamanda cathartica 'Compacta'


- A must in your garden with butter yellow 3" flowers blooming spring through fall
- Moderately drought and salt tolerant
- Evergreen with narrow bright glossy green leaves
- Good front of border, ground cover or low hedge

Angelonia

Angelonia angustifolia

- White, purple or blue flowers
- Fast-growing, dies back in summer, reseeds
- Moderate drought tolerance
- Attracts butterflies, bees






Asian Snow

Wrightia antidysenterica

- Blooms with small white flowers all year long
- Requires very little trimming, keeps a neat shape
- Great for containers and small spaces in the landscape





Baby Sunrose

Aptenia cordifolia

- Bright red or golden yellow flowers appear year round
- Glossy green foliage cascades over walls or rims of pots
- Excellent low-growing filler plant for a dry, hot area
- Also known as Heartleaf Ice Plant






Bahama Cassia or Senna

Cassia bahamensis or C. chapmanii

- Yellow flower attracts butterflies year round
- Lives about 4-5 years
- Ornamental shrub for screening or border
- Well-drained, acid, sandy soil; drought tolerant







Balloon Plant

Gomphocarpus physocarpus

- A member of the milkweed family
- Small white flowers followed by green spherical fruits
- Stems can be cut and dried
- A sure conversation starter plant





Bay Cedar

Suriana maritima

- Excellent front-line plant, grows in direct salt wind
- Shrub or small tree is sculpted by the winds
- Leaves tiny, greyish green, grow in rosette pattern
- Numerous small yellow flowers close at night



Ficus carica "Brown Turkey"

- Tasty brownish-purple fruit in late summer
- Prune after fruiting or late summer
- Attractive foliage
- Loves Acidic soil






Bulbine

Bulbine frutescens

- Orange or yellow flowers
- Great for ground cover or container plant
- Moderate drought tolerance
- Attracts butterflies, birds, bees





Burle Marx Philodendron

Philodendron "Burle Marx"

- Exceptional ground cover with glossy, evergreen leaves
- Fast growing and easy care with annual pruning
- Named after Roberto Burle Marx, a famous Brazilian landscape architect; a Key West favorite



Cabada Palm

Chrysalidocarpus cabadae

- Smooth, boldly ringed trunks make a showy display in a courtyard or small space
- Multi-trunk specimen palm with moderate growth rate
- Highly drought-tolerant once established
- Easy-care palm adapts to a wide range of soils



Caricature Plant

Graptophyllum pictum

- Also known as Map Plant or Jamaican Croton
- Grown for vibrant foliage with pink or white patterns
- Regular pruning will keep it to desired size
- Not a good choice for heavy iguana areas










Cockscomb

Celosia plumosa

- Showy flowers of red, yellow, pink, purple or orange look like rooster crests
- Unique annual for your butterfly garden
- Plants reseed freely if spent blossoms are not removed
- Celosia argentea is a shorter feathery variety

Coontie

Zamia integrifolia

- Adds tropical accent as groundcover
- Phallic brown 3-6" cone with bright orange seeds
- Florida's only native cycad, closely related to pines
- Native Americans and early settlers commercially harvested the poisonous tuber as Florida arrowroot





Cordyline or Ti Plant

Cordyline fruticosa 'Red Sister'

- Prized for its year-round showy foliage
- Best in containers to provide acidic soil
- Pest-free pop of color in a snowbird garden
- Other varieties provide different color options






Corky Stem Passionflower

Passiflora suberosa

- Low climbing vine with extremely variable leaves
- Small greenish flowers, small berries
- Corky growth on mature stems
- Larval host plant, butterfly garden plant





Croton

Codiaeum variegatum

- Wide variety of leaf color and shape
- Great for adding color to the garden
- Low drought tolerance
- Sap is harmful if ingested



Crown of Thorns

Euphorbia milii

- Delicate flowers in pink, yellow, red or white with spines on the stem
- Needs well-drained soil
- Drought tolerant; good for seaside conditions
- Milky sap may irritate skin





Desert Rose

Adenium

- Don't be afraid to prune
- Shallow container produces larger caudex
- Oleander caterpillar may decimate the leaves, but they will grow back





Dioon (Giant)

Dioon spinulosum

- Strikingly elegant cycad with evergreen leaves
- A New World primitive American genus that predates the dinosaurs
- Gracefully arched blue-green fronds radiate from trunk
- Excellent for low-maintenance gardens

Elephant Ear, Stingray

Alocasia macrorrhizzos 'Stingray'

- Resembles stingray with long thin tail
- Fast-growing, outstanding ornamental
- Propagate by dividing rhizomes
- Deer resistant



Fiddlewood

Citharexylum spinosum

- White fragrant flower spikes curving down from glossy green leaves
- Fruit equally attractive, golden turns reddish brown
- Provides food and cover for wildlife
- Vigorous grower, prunes well






Firebush - Native

Hamelia patens

- Fast-growing tree attracts wildlife
- Blooms heaviest in spring and summer
- Drought-tolerant when established





Foxtail Fern

Asparagus densiflorus 'Myers'

- Soft, delicate tufts (no flowers) on cold-hardy plant
- Considered deer resistant
- Ground cover, border or accent plant
- Mildly salt tolerant



- Named for drooping trails of golden berries
- Fast-growing, hardy and drought-tolerant
- Berries are poisonous to humans and pets
- Many varieties of sizes, foliage and colors are available






Indian Mallow


Abutilon

- Also known as Flowering Maple
- Bell-shaped flowers come in a variety of colors
- Can be easily trimmed to desired size






Jamaica Caper


Capparis cynophallophora

- Showy flowers open white turn pink in a few hours
- High tolerance for salt winds but not long term flooding, attractive plant for coastal gardens
- Unusual fruit pods, curl, rupture, expose red interior
- Not edible, shiny green leaves are coppery beneath






Juanulloa Gold Finger

Juanulloa aurantiaca

- Showy bright orange flowers
- Unique flower shape is real conversation starter
- Fast, vining growth habit ideal to cover a low fence
- Can bloom on and off year round in bright sun

Lady Palm

Rhapis excelsa

- Small densely clumping palm
- Dark green, widely split, fan-shaped leaves
- Used as a shrub or screen
- One of the few palms that will thrive in low light or shady landscapes

Lipstick Palm

Cyrtostachys renda

- Popular ornamental palm with striking red stems
- Likes moist soil but not wind or salt spray
- Slow growing, no pest or disease problems
- Excellent palm for a container; protect from weather below 40 degrees

Liriope

Liriope muscari

- Easy care evergreen ground cover
- Excellent companion to blooming plants
- Drought-tolerant when established
- Variegated version provides visual interest

Marlberry

Ardisia escallonioides

- Very attractive small tree produces white blooms and purple berries on and off all year round
- Excellent food source for birds and butterflies
- Use to screen undesirable views
- Retains dense growth habit even in partial shade






Mexican Flame Vine

Senecio confusus

- Fast-growing vine on a fence, trellis or palm
- Orange-red daisy-like flowers with golden centers
- Great pop of color to attract butterflies, bees and hummingbirds
- Flowers most in summer, but flowers appear all year






Mexican Sage

Salvia leucantha

- Superior plant for attracting wildlife
- Drought tolerant after established, but appearance is neater with regular watering
- Good choice for a butterfly garden





Milkweed

Asclepias syriaca L.

- Scarlet or yellow flowers
- Host/nectar plant for the Monarch Butterfly
- Sap may be toxic to pets
- Reseeds itself



Milkweed, Giant

Calotropis gigantea

- Fragrant jewel-like blooms most of the year
- Shapely shrub is evergreen and fast-growing
- Nectar and larval host for Monarch butterflies
- Choose planting location carefully as Monarch caterpillars will periodically chew the leaves






Muhly Grass

Muhlenbergia capillaris

- Pink, fall flowers in showy plumes
- Tolerates short periods of drought and flooding
- Ornamental grass, herbaceous perennial
- Coastal and inland: border or accent





Musical Note Clerodendrum

Clerodendrum incisum

- Flower buds resemble musical notes, opening to showy white blossoms with red stamens
- Shapely shrub blooms on and off year round
- Requires regular water for consistent blooms

Old Man Palm

Coccothrinax crinita

- Small slender palm is native to Cuba
- Hair-like fibers covering entire trunk give it a thicker appearance, resembling the beard of an old man
- Used as specimen, happy in container or ground
- Prefers alkaline soil, no disease or pest problems



Epidendrum radicans






Orchid - Schomburgkia

Schomburgkia


- Large rhizomes which gradually turn yellow
- Can be attached to a tree or placed in a large pot with loose orchid medium
- Flower stems can be up to 5 ft long

Vanilla planifolia






Alexander Palm

Ptychosperma elegans

- Solitaire palm, grows with a single trunk
- Light gray trunk has maximum diameter of 4 inches
- Fruits are bright red
- Good palm for small yards




Ptychosperma burretianum

Ptychosperma burretianum

- Small to medium-sized palm with slender stems
- Tightly-clumping species with red seeds in summer

Average water with well-drained soil






Panama Rose

Rondeletia leucophylla

- Beautiful shrub with pink flowers all year
- Great accent plant or hedge along property line
- Salt and wind tolerant for hurricanes
- Low-maintenance fast-growing plant






Pearlberry

Vallessia antillana

- Produces small white flowers and pearl-like fruits
- Easily pruned
- Good border plant
- Endangered in FL



Pentas, Starflower

Pentas lanceolata

- Many colors (red, pink, white, lilac); star shaped
- Fast growing in any well-drained soil
- · Background shrub or foreground
- Plant with other butterfly-attracting plants





Plumbago

Plumbago auriculata cvs.

- Reliable all year bloomer with blue or white flowers
- Attracts butterflies
- Hardy, self-sufficient, once established
- Mounding growth habit makes plumbago ideal around trees



• Profuse all-year bloomer






Plumeria

- Best fragrant flowering with maximum sunshine
- Drought tolerant, very little water, well-drained soil






Ponytail Palm

Beaucarnea recurvata

- Distinctive foliage resembles a pony's tail
- Swollen base adds visual interest to the landscape
- Not a true palm but a member of the agave family





Powderpuff - Pink

Calliandra surinamensis

- Showy blooms look like powderpuffs
- Drought tolerant when established
- Iguanas like the buds and blossoms
- Standard and dwarf (C. emarginata) variety blooms on and off all year





Pseuderanthemum Shooting Star

Pseuderanthemum seticalyx


- Easy-care shrub for a large container
- Glossy green leaves with red undersides
- Pretty white flowers bloom year round
- Sturdy, slow-growing shrub will last for years

P. laxiflorum 'Purple Dazzler'

- Spectacular purple flowers and variegated foliage
- Best color in full sun
- Easy care color for snowbirds
- Thrives in large pots






Purple Passionflower

Passiflora incarnata

- Showy evergreen, purple flower, edible green fruit
- Use as vine, hedge or cascading over a wall
- Pinch back first season to encourage bushiness
- Larval host, nectar source, butterfly garden plant






Purslane

Portulaca oleracea

- Fast-growing succulent with showy flowers
- Good for colorful borders or containers
- Many cultivars provide a wide range of color choices





Pygmy Date Palm

Phoenix roebelenii

- Superior specimen plant for the Keys
- Very hardy and slow growing
- Clumps of three add grace and interest to the landscape
- Proper fertilization important to keep it looking its best




Royal Poinciana

Delonix regia

- Flamboyant orange/red summer flowers
- Requires a large area
- Tolerates any type of well-drained soil and pH
- High drought tolerance






Salvia

Salvia

- Reliable annual bloomer comes in a variety of colors
- · Reseeds freely if blooms not deadheaded
- Excellent choice for casual landscape
- Regular trimming will maintain a tidy appearance

Sea Oxeye Daisy Green

Borrichia frutescens

- Yellow flowers
- Medium shrub with shiny green leaves
- Colonial, spreads broader than tall
- Coastal wildflower



Sea Oxeye Daisy Silver

Borrichia arborescens

- Yellow flowers
- Medium shrub with silvery-green leaves
- Colonial, spreads broader than tall
- Coastal wildflower





Shrimp Plant, Golden

Pachystachys lutea

- Reliable bright bloomer in light shade
- Bright yellow bracts with white flowers
- Blooms year-round in the Keys
- Great as a ground cover or in containers
- Prune annually. Can become leggy, especially in shady areas






Shrimp Plant - Red

Justicia brandegeana

- Great color in partial shade
- · Prefers acidic soil
- Golden Shrimp Plant (Pachystachys lutea) is a related species






Silver Buttonwood

Conocarpus erectus

- White/cream spring flowers and beautiful silver leaves
- High wind resistance and drought tolerance
- Provides cover and nesting for birds/wildlife
- Susceptible to sooty mold from insects






Spineless Century Plant

Agave attenuata

- May take 10 years to bloom
- Light bluish-green foliage with no spine
- Tolerates drought and moderate salt exposure

Staghorn Fern

Platycerium spp.

- Easy care
- Mount on tree, board or hanging basket
- Best in bright indirect light
- Loves regular balanced fertilizer, such as 20-20-20



Stephanotis

Stephanotis floribunda

- Vine that thrives along a fence or up a stairway
- Blooms in clusters with a nice fragrance
- Evergreen with shiny green waxy leaves
- Moderately salt tolerant





Succulent Gardens

Succulent gardens

- Must be protected from hot mid-day sun
- Prune or replace overgrown plants
- Easiest way to kill them is to overwater






Succulents for landscaping

- Perfect for dry areas in the garden
- Many leaf shapes and colors
- Iguana resistant
- Easiest way to kill them is to overwater



Sweet Almond Bush

Aloysia virgata

- Spiked white flower clusters of sweet fragrance bloom repeatedly spring through fall
- An upright tree/shrub with vigorous growth
- Drought tolerant once established
- Pruning after bloom cycle will give dense growth





Vietnamese Gardenia

Gardenia (Kailarsenia) vietnamensis

- Unique medium size shrub
- Prized for sweet scented 3" flowers
- Excellent for containers
- Flowers are good for cutting






Walking Iris

Neomarica sp.

- Clumping rhizomes, with air roots for replanting
- White, blue or yellow flowers
- Blooms last a day but will continue to flower
- Tolerates both drought and flooding





White Candles

Whitfieldia elongata

- One of the few reliable bloomers for a shady spot
- Excellent choice for a snowbird gardener
- Provides a nice backdrop to shrimp plants
- Moderate trimming will create a fuller plant



Wild Coffee

Psychotria nervosa

- Shiny dark green foliage; well-drained soil
- White flowers, spring through summer
- Susceptible to pests; moderate salt tolerance
- Red fruit provides food for wildlife






Wild Lantana or Wild Sage

Lantana involucrata

- Whitish flowers with yellow throat in clusters
- Drupe fruit, magenta in clusters; food for birds
- Low salt water tolerance; salt wind tolerance
- Crushed leaves smell like sage






Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow

Brunfelsia grandiflora

- Beautiful white, purple, blue flowers spring fall
- Excellent for border or accent
- Some drought resistance, susceptible to scale insects
- Dwarf variety to 5', full to part sun, needs more watering and container friendly
